CLINT MALARCHUK

Clint Malarchuk

Malarchuk, who was born in Grand Prairie, Alberta and raised in Edmonton, played junior hockey in the Western Hockey League. He went on to play professionally in the NHL for the Quebec Nordiques, the Washington Capitals, and the Buffalo Sabres, and in the IHL for the Las Vegas Thunder. In 1987, Malarchuk was named to the NHL All-Star team and, in 1989, was the recipient of the Punch Imlack award for leadership and dedication to the game of hockey.

After retiring from the NHL as a player, Malarchuk served as head coach of the IHL Las Vegas Thunder and the Idaho Steelheads. He was then a goaltending coach for the NHL Florida Panthers, Columbus Blue Jackets, Atlanta Thrashers, and Calgary Flames. Malarchuk was inducted into the New York State Hockey Hall of Fame in May 2022.

In 2008, Malarchuk survived a suicide attempt. After recovering physically, mentally, and emotionally, he became a mental health advocate and a renowned professional speaker on mental health. He speaks to his journey living with OCD, PTSD, depression, and anxiety. In recognition of his advocacy work, Malarchuk received an honourary doctorate from Nipissing University in 2017. In addition, Malarchuk is the author of The Crazy Game: How I Survived in the Crease and Beyond.

Sarah Padilla Technical Director Cordage Institute

Sarah Padilla is the Technical Director of the Cordage Institute, an organization that aims to educate end users, government agencies and other entities on the proper use of cordage products thru the dissemination of standards. She has been the Technical Director for over 5 years and worked in testing and synthetic fiber products for nearly 15 years. She worked for Dyneema®, a high-performance fiber company where she was responsible for the U.S. textile and ballistics lab, provided technical support, and worked with customers on new product applications. Prior to Dyneema, she worked for Tension Member Technology (TMT), a leader in testing services of tension systems, gaining hands-on experience testing ropes/cables/webbing, performing forensic failure analysis, testing electro/optical/mechanical properties of cables, writing rope/cable specifications and fabricating test machines. She graduated from Boston University with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. She resides in Houston with her family and enjoys outdoor activities



Greg D'Elia Director of Engineering Slingmax Rigging Solutions

Greg D'Elia is the Director of Engineering for Slingmax Rigging Solutions. He serves on the American Society of Mechanical Engineers B30.9 Subcommittee for Slings. Greg is also the Chair of the Roundsling Subcommittee for the Cordage Institute. Prior to his nine years at Slingmax, he had nine years of experience in engineering high performance ropes and strength members.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering and a Master of Engineering Management both from Penn State University.

Greg lives in Hatboro, PA with his wife Laura, and t hree children Harrison, Quentin, and Carina. He also serves on the Upper Moreland Township School Board where his children attend school.



Curtis Dubay Chief Economist at the

U.S. Chamber of Commerce

Curtis Dubay is the Chief Economist at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. He tracks the condition of the economy, analyzes the impact of public policy on economic growth, and runs the Chamber's Chief Economists

Committee. Previously, he was senior economist at the American Bankers Association and a research fellow in tax and economic policy at The Heritage Foundation. He also worked at the accounting firm PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) and at the Tax Foundation.

Dubay has researched and published frequently on a wide range of tax and economic issues. He is regularly quoted by the press and has appeared often in the media, including on CNBC, Fox Business, Fox News, and C-SPAN. He has testified before Congress several times and been cited in newspapers such as The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times, The Washington Post, USA Today, and Politico.

Dubay received his master's degree in economics from the University of Connecticut and his bachelor's degree in economics and leadership studies from the University of Richmond. He resides in Washington, D.C., with his wife and three sons.



Jim D. Wiethorn, Ph.D., P.E., NAC

INTERNATIONAL CRANE & CONSTRUCTION SAFETY SOLUTIONS, LLC. ENGINEERING SPECIALIST

Jim Wiethorn is an Engineering Specialist at International Crane & Construction Safety Solutions, LLC, Houston, Texas,

and licensed as a professional engineer in 34 states. He has evaluated over 1200 crane and rigging failures throughout the United States and abroad and has compiled the largest data base of crane accidents in the world. Dr. Wiethorn serves on the ASME B30 main committee, as well as the B30.3, Tower Cranes, and B30.29, Self-Erecting Tower Cranes sub-committees. In 2014 Dr. Wiethorn published, Crane Accidents: A Study of Causes & Trends to Create a Safer Work Environment, 1983-2013, which detailed results of the study of over 500 crane accidents. In 2018, Dr. Wiethorn completed his Ph.D. with the publication of his dissertation, An Analysis of Critical Factors of Lift Planning to Improve Crane Safety Based on Forensic Causation of Crane Accidents, based on 701 crane accidents. Dr. Wiethorn holds four patents associated with crane safety operations. Dr. Wiethorn and Texas A&M University have aligned to form the Crane Safety Research Lab (CSRL) to house the largest crane accident data base in the world, as well as development and testing of safety related systems and devices for the crane industry.





Timothy W. Klein, PE

Principal Engineer – Fabrication and Structures WireCo

For the past 23 years Timothy W. Klein has worked in the Fabricated Products Division at WireCo. He is currently the Principal Engineer of

Fabrications and Structures and leads the Engineering Team in these markets. He is a licensed Professional Engineer in the state of Missouri, New York, and New Jersey as well as holding a Professional Engineering License in Canada. He earned his Bachelors and Masters of Science degrees in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Missouri Science and Technology. Tim has several published papers on the mechanics of wire rope and currently serves on the Main Committee of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers B30 and is the Chair of the B30.26 Subcommittee. He is also the past Chairman of the Wire Rope Technical Board, and Chairs the Wire Rope and Sling Subcommittee for the American Wire Rope Fabricators Technical Association. Tim is a proud Veteran of the US Army and continues to stay active outside of work spending time with his family and volunteering with the community.






