The Antitrust Statement of Associated Wire Rope Fabricators

Since a trade association is by nature a group of competitors with the capacity for collusive activities which can result in restraint of trade, it is important to emphasize the intent of A.W.R.F. to act in strict compliance with all state and federal antitrust laws.

The two principal antitrust laws which are particularly applicable to trade associations are:

*-Sections One and Two of the Sherman Act, and,
-Section Five of the Federal Trade Commission Act.*

These acts respectively prohibit contracts, combinations, and conspiracies in restraint of trade, monopolies and attempts to monopolize, unfair methods of competition, and unfair or deceptive business practices.

The most blatant illegal restraint of trade involves price-fixing. Price-fixing may involve competitors, or suppliers and their customers with respect to resale price. A.W.R.F. will not tolerate any discussion of prices at any association meetings; nor will it allow discussion of any agreements or arrangements which inferentially address price-fixing or any other form of antitrust behavior.

AWRF GENERAL MEETINGS POLICY
Adopted 1990. Revised 1992, 1995, 2000, and October 18, 2004.

I. PURPOSES

The primary purpose of conducting AWRF association general meetings is to promote interests common among companies manufacturing, fabricating or distributing products and services within the lifting, rigging, and load securement industries, and to disseminate technical information related to the conduct of businesses within those industries and allied industries.

The purpose of conducting AWRF association general meetings is primarily educational and secondarily social. The purpose of inviting guests to meetings is to stimulate new membership. All guests are to be treated as if they were members during the meeting. Guests pay all the same fees as members, and may not be invited a second time without approval of the Directors.

II. FREQUENCY, DURATION, AND LOCATION OF THE MEETINGS

Semi-annual meetings at varied locations, from two to four days duration, are conducted to serve the purposes of the Association, as required by stipulations of the Association By-Laws, and subject to the requirements of all applicable Federal, State and Local regulations and laws. From time to time, as authorized by the Directors, special events, such as exhibitions, demonstrations or recreational gatherings, conducted at special locations, may be added to the meeting. All special events must be open to all registered attendees.

III. TEN RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT OF GENERAL MEETINGS:

1. The Association's Code of Ethics governs personal/professional behavior at meetings.
2. The costs of the meeting are defrayed by registration fees, paid equally by all attendees. Each attendee pays a single registration fee in full, regardless of full or partial involvement. No fees are refunded except by prior notice and explanation. All guests and all attending spouses also pay the same fee in full. No partial, or prorated fees, are calculated or charged under any circumstances.
3. Fees for certain optional events designated by the Directors are paid separately from the meeting registration fee. Participation is limited to members who have already paid the full registration fee.
4. Presentations by speakers should be generic. Every possible effort should be exerted to avoid any advertising or promotional materials. Speakers should be familiar with the Association Antitrust Policy. If there are concerns regarding a presentation not being generic, it should be reviewed by either the Chief Association Executive (CAE) and/or the Chairperson of the Programs Committee prior to its delivery to the members. Additionally, presentations should be made available to the members either by way of a handout or electronic format. Prospective speakers must be alerted to these requirements from the onset.
5. Courtesy to speakers is mandatory
6. No "hospitality suites" are permitted. Marketing of industry products or services by AWRF members, guests or other attendees shall be conducted with discretion in order to avoid interference with organized convention activities. It is inappropriate to distribute promotional materials, actively solicit customers or conduct business discussions concerning price and/or delivery during meetings or other AWRF functions except at designated events.
7. No closed, clandestine or selective meetings, events, tours, exhibitions etc. will be tolerated or permitted during AWRF General Meetings. The locations, and specific opening and closing times of the AWRF general meetings will be firmly established and announced in advance to avoid debate. Traditionally, General Meetings begin at 5 pm on Sunday and close at 6-7 pm Wednesday. Individual business contacts are allowed, except during receptions and meetings.
8. Meetings are open only to registered member attendees, spouses, speakers and invited guests. Uninvited persons will be asked to either join, by paying the required dues and fees, or else depart.
9. Identification badges will be provided to all registered attendees to be worn at all functions.
10. Any individual person desiring to make a complaint or raise a question concerning these rules should address the matter in writing to the Association office or in person to the Chief Executive. The Directors will address questions or complaints on an individual basis if properly presented.

Thomas M. Sullivan - Vice President, Small Business Policy

Thomas M. Sullivan is vice president of small business policy at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Working with chambers of commerce and the U.S. Chamber’s nation-wide network, Sullivan harnesses the views of small businesses and translates that grassroots power into federal policies that bolster free enterprise and reward entrepreneurship. He runs the U.S. Chamber’s Small Business Council and the Mid-Markets Business Council, engaging those members on a regular basis to increase small business input and involvement in Chamber activities.

Previously, Sullivan was an attorney in the government relations practice of Nelson Mullins Riley & Scarborough, LLP, a law firm with a major East Coast presence from Tallahassee to Boston. Before rejoining Nelson Mullins, he served as general counsel for the Bipartisan Policy Center, a nonprofit organization founded in 2007 by former Senate Majority Leaders Howard Baker, Tom Daschle, Bob Dole, and George Mitchell.

Sullivan represented several firm clients before Congress and federal agencies and built a small business advocacy platform that included the Coalition for Responsible Business Finance, a group of non-bank small business providers, and the Small Business Coalition for Regulatory Relief.

Sullivan served under President George W. Bush as the highest-ranking government official charged with exclusively advocating the views and needs of small business before government agencies and Congress. As chief counsel for advocacy at the U.S. Small Business Administration, he was directly involved in more than 100 regulatory and legislative matters, testified frequently before congressional committees, and was a spokesman on economic conditions and entrepreneurship. The hallmark

of his tenure at SBA was a national legislative initiative guaranteeing that small business has a voice in state regulatory decisions. Upon leaving government, Sullivan was named to the National Federation of Independent Business Small Business Legal Center Advisory Board, and he serves on the board of directors of the Global Entrepreneurship Network, a platform of programs and initiatives aimed at creating an entrepreneurial ecosystem.

Sullivan earned his Juris Doctor from Suffolk University Law School in 1993 and a Bachelor of Arts in English in 1989 from Boston College. He lives in Virginia with his wife and two sons.

Kris Paronto - Former Ranger, 2nd Battalion, 75th Regiment

Kris Paronto - “Tanto” as he is affectionately known in security contracting circles - is a former Army Ranger from 2nd Battalion 75th Ranger Regiment and private security contractor who has deployed throughout South America, Central America, the Middle East and North Africa. He also worked with the US Government’s Global Response Staff conducting low profile security in high threat environments throughout the world. Mr. Paronto was part the CIA annex security team that responded to the terrorist attack on the US Special Mission in Benghazi, Libya, September 11th, 2012, helping to save over 20 lives while fighting off terrorists from the CIA Annex for over 13 hours. Mr. Paronto’s story is told in the book “13 Hours” written by Mitchell Zuckoff and his five surviving annex security team members. Kris’ newly released memoir, “The Ranger Way” is now available for pre-order and is being released on May 23rd.

Mr. Paronto was born in Alamosa, Colorado and obtained his Associate Degree from Dixie College (now Dixie State University) in St. George, Utah, Bachelor’s Degree from Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colorado and Master’s Degree from The University of Nebraska at Omaha. He served 4 years in the US Army and an additional 4 years in the US Army National Guard reaching the rank of Sergeant then becoming a commissioned officer in 2003. He started contracting for Blackwater Security Consulting in 2003 and continued to deploy on various security contracts, to include the Global Response Staff until 2013. Mr. Paronto has been involved in security operations in hostile environments for over 10 years. His team’s involvement with the September 11th, 2012 attack on the US special mission in Benghazi, Libya was paramount in the saving of US lives and assets. He is a proven leader, teammate and friend to those who have deployed with him, and a devout father to three children.





Knut Buschmann - President and General Manager– Unirole Limited

Knut Buschmann is President and General Manager of Unirole Ltd., located in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada with fabrication locations in Montreal, Mississauga, and Edmonton. He is the former President of AWRP (Associated Wire Rope Fabricators), and continues to be a member of the AWRP Technical Committee where he is currently developing Test Method Procedures for the rigging industry. He also is a former President and current Member the Board of the OIPEEC, the International Organization for the Study of Rope (a European Science Organization) and a member of the CI-Cordage Institute’s Management Board and it’s Technical Committee. Caroline L. Harris - Vice President, Tax Policy, and Chief Tax Policy Counsel

Caroline L. Harris is vice president, tax policy and economic development, and chief tax policy counsel at the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. She directs the development, promotion, and publication of the Chamber’s policy on tax-related matters. Additionally, she works with other Chamber policy centers in their efforts to advance specific policies to improve economic growth.

She analyzes tax legislation, other legislation with revenue-raising provisions and growth impacts, and tax reform proposals, and submits comments, Hill letters, and testimony to Congress and regulatory agencies. Harris routinely meets with members of Congress and their staffs, the administration, and regulatory agencies to promote the Chamber’s tax policy.

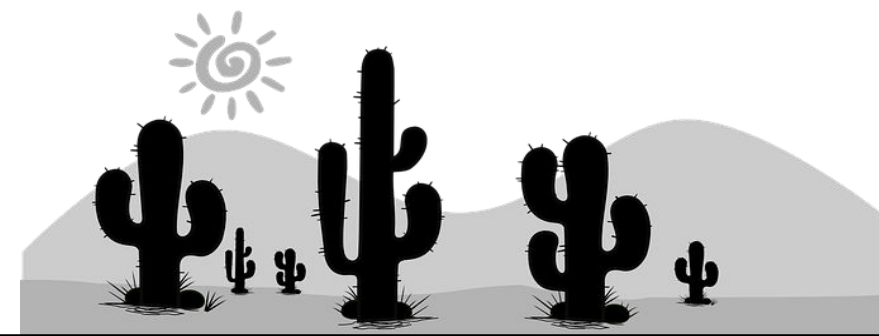

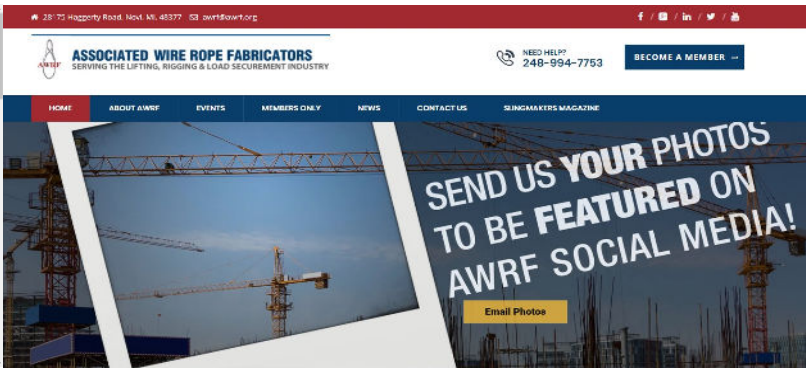
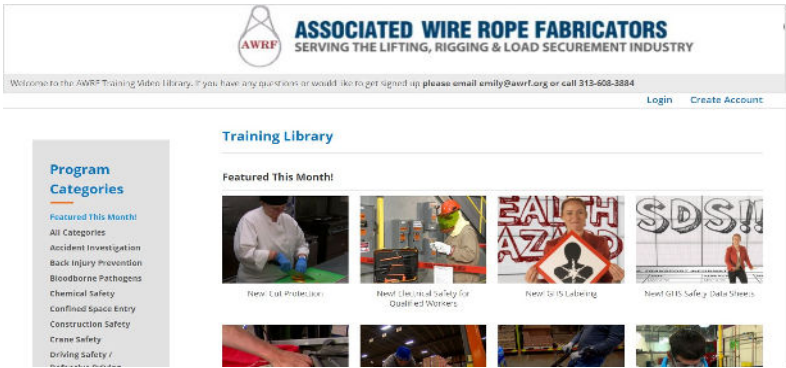

Camelback Golf Club

Arthur Hills redesigned the club’s original course in 1999. The result is a classic desert design that has been modernized. Among the improvements are bunkers that pop up everywhere and wide fairways that often split. The par-3s are on the long side, including the daunting 220-yard 17th.

Unlike the other course at the Camelback Golf Club, the Padre Course has a parkland design that is situated on gently rolling terrain covered with lush vegetation. Although the pleasant scenery and beautiful vistas of the course are inviting, golfers should be prepared for a challenge. The landscape provides several natural hazards with towering trees scattered throughout and multiple lakes that come into play on several holes. The course is also heavily bunkered to truly test golfers. The finishing hole is a notably challenging hole that features water, Arizona Golf Magazine even named it the best water hole in the state.

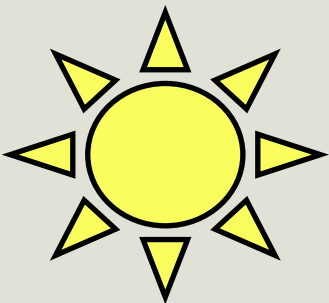
